New styles in music

Kritik:

.... The following morning provided a complete contrast when Peter Waters, an Australian concert pianist living in Switzerland, appeared in evening dress and in sixty minutes reviewed the history of piano music „in one easy lesson“. He did this by playing works by early keyboard masters such as Bach and Mozart through to the romantics including Liszt and on to impressionist music, Bernstein, and Lennon

and McCartney. Following this performance Ram Gidoomal, an Asian businessman living in England spoke inspiringly about „Conference with Clients“ to finish the meeting on a positive, up-beat note.

One of the most interesting messages came out of the musical session when Peter Waters played a piece by Ravel called „Une Barque sur l’Océan“ which tells the story of a ship sailing on a sunny day, encountering and surviving a storm and coming into calm waters at the end. A survey taken afterwards showed that while all the client advisers listened to the music as though they were on the ship and experienced the storm personally, all the support staff watched the boat being tossed on the waves from the safety of dry land!

The benefits from this weekend will be only revealed as the client advisers put the lessons they have learned into practice in their day to day relationship activities. However, the opinions expressed by the participants as they left Wolfsberg on Sunday afternoon can be summed up in the words of one member of the Business Sector who said simply „I feel as though my mind has been opened“.
